By expanding my knowledge of equestrian history and culture through these events, I will further my personal growth and professional development.

## 2025 Competition Plan

Under Mr. Martin's guidance, my focus for 2025 will be to achieve the Minimum Eligibility Requirements (MER) for CCI3\* (both short and long formats) by competing in the following events:

- 1. May 3-4, 2025: USEA Intercollegiate and Interscholastic Eventing Championships (Stable View, South Carolina).
- 2. June 2025: Bromont CCI (Quebec, Canada).
- 3. August 26-31, 2025: USEA American Eventing Championships (AEC) (Galway Downs, Temecula, California).
- 4. Late September 2025: Area Championships (various U.S. locations).

After obtaining the CCI3\* MER, I plan to progress to CCI4\* by 2027. By 2026, I aim to qualify for the World Equestrian Games (WEG) in Aachen, Germany. In 2027, I will target CCI5\* events to further hone my skills and competitiveness. By 2028, I intend to meet the qualification standards for the Los Angeles Olympics and earn selection to represent Japan.

## Funding and Financial Plan
